SYNOPSIS

La Cena per farli conoscere A Dinner for Them to Meet

A comedy, as lacerating as it is comical, set in the present day, in Rome, at Christmas time with its shimmering lights...

Time seems to stop when Sandro Lanza's three ravishing successful daughters in Rome, Paris, and Madrid, each receive an urgent call to rush to their father's bedside. Indeed, the once popular TV star, now relegated to begging bit parts in afternoon soaps, has stunned them all by staging a desperate suicide attempt that was almost successful.

Yet their father is a total stranger to the three now grown-up women, all by different mothers. All of whom the actor eventually abandoned for yet another sexy starlet during his long career in the industry that was now, to his disbelief, turning its back on him.

The intense dark and elegant Ines, a brilliant journalist in Paris. Clara, a statuesque stunning blonde with a thriving medical practice in Spain. The tender delicate Betty, a young sensuous bride of a mysterious Roman gentleman. All feel strangely compelled to suspend their lives as if irresistibly drawn to Betty's appeal to meet at once in her luxurious Italian villa.

What awaits these four adults in this timeless moment when roles of "father" "daughter" "past" seem to dissolve into simply "human beings" and "living"? Certainly not at all what they expected. And the crucial dinner party so painstakingly planned for their father's encounter with his ideal woman? Perhaps a dinner for them to meet, truly. And the chance to receive the incredibly mundane yet precious gift of simply loving.

director's note

Among my films, LA CENA PER FARLI CONOSCERE / A DINNER FOR THEM TO MEET belongs to the handful of my works about the present day. I had done this, each time from a different perspective, whenever society was undergoing a change: from Ultimo Minuto to Regalo di Natale, from Festival to Impegnati, from Fratelli e sorelle to Ma quando arrivano le ragazze. Though with different contexts, they were all strongly representative of a present day that I wanted to slowly reveal.

Just as the world of bankers helped me, at least partially, to reconstruct the eighties, in *A DINNER FOR THEM TO MEET* I decided to look at today's world through a show biz character from the TV world. He (Sandro Lanza / Diego Abatantuono) is a has-been soap actor. Through our protagonist, we focus on the quality of relationships today, particularly those of the family.

I called my story a "sentimental comedy". This was in the attempt (hopefully successful) of respecting the brio and incisiveness of comedy, yet combining it with the suffering that seems to be so widespread.

I had felt compelled for a long time, almost like a duty, to take a look at certain attitudes and lifestyles that unfortunately have become so fashionable. Yet it was only with this unusual family story did I finally find the narrative opportunity I was looking for. Working with this situation, my characters – a totally irresponsible father and his three daughters scattered around the world – slowly grew in my mind.

Through this story I hoped to express how difficult middle age is for all of us, but most of all for those who have been spoiled by life. For the role of such a protagonist, I realised immediately that I was writing for Diego. I knew he would play the part without ever losing control, with that involvement that would make his character totally convincing, arousing both hilarity and the sadness of broken hearts. And that was exactly what he did.

For the four female roles, geographically spanning Rome, Paris and Madrid, we indulged in the privilege of having both Ines and Vanessa with us again. They had already been our accomplices in the cast of two successful films. And, to them we added Violante Placido, who for a few years now I had been following with interest.

Francesca Neri (though she'll deny it) refused a part in one of my films about fifteen years ago. I got my 'revenge' by offering her a role that was light years away from the territory familiar to her. An extremely perilous role. She accepted it, like a challenge. And I feel she has triumphed.

PUPI AVATI

Note by Antonio Avati

Despite our long experience producing films, La CENA PER FARLI CONOSCERE / A DINNER FOR THEM TO MEET was still one of the most pleasant experiences of them all. It was also one of the easiest to organize from a production point of view. Apart from the quality of the film itself, the film will be remembered as the chance to apply the legendary "French hours" during the entire shoot. That is, by not interfering with concentration by taking breaks, the cast and crew prepared to finish the working day by three in the afternoon... This was also possible thanks to the genre of the film itself: a comedy.

More than half of the story takes place in one location, the splendid villa where the dinner of the title takes place. All of the interiors of this rich abode were reconstructed in Cinecittà's mythic Studio 5, so beloved of Federico Fellini. For the first 5 to 6 weeks we were therefore able to concentrate on the various units, plan the lighting, characters, and coordinate the actors. In the meantime, another section concentrated on organizing exteriors as the action was also set in Rome during Christmas.

The excitement of working on this project was undoubtedly related to the shared concern (especially Pupi's and mine) of a great potential danger: here we would be working with four actresses and stars all at once. How highly probable that even from the first "Action!", a climate of fierce competition would set in. Factions, disputes at make-up, costumes, on the set. But, in fact, none of this happened. My brother's charisma and, perhaps, my own long experience helped Ines Sastre, Vanessa Incontrada, Violante Placido and Francesca Neri to interact in genuine team spirit, even cheering each other on.

As for Diego Abatantuono, this was not our first film together. Each time, these films have further consolidated our friendship. Each production has given us the chance to appreciate Diego's attentiveness, his emotional involvement in the project itself.

A DINNER FOR THEM TO MEET was made thanks to the support of Medusa. The company participated in production costs (with a subsequent contribution from Sky). This gave us a reasonable average-sized budget, similar to the budget of our previous film coproduced with RAI Cinema.

filmography DIEGO ABATANTUONO

Born in Milan in the popular neighborhood of Giambellino, even as a youngster Diego Abatantuono was a regular at "The Derby". This was the famous cabaret, owned by his uncles, where popular artists performed. And here Abatantuono began working as lights engineer and stage manager, soon coming into contact with personalities such as Jannacci, Boldi, Porcaro, Faletti, Salvi and the Gatti di Vicolo Miracoli. In 1975 he in fact became art director of the Derby. Success was soon to follow and, after a period as a cabaret artist, Abatantuono was cast in a series of films among which "Il Papocchio", "Fantozzi contro tutti", and "Fico d'India". The films "Tango della gelosia" (by Steno), "I Fichissimi", and "Eccezzziunale veramente" (by Carlo Vanzina) paved the way for leading roles for the actor. His Terrunciello in these films so inspired the public that his persona became a veritable social model, emulated and imitated by countless fans. In 1984 Abantatuono worked almost exclusively in theatre (gaining acclaim in Molière's "Don Giovanni", directed by Franco Morini). In 1986 he starred in "Regalo di Natale", directed by Pupi Avati. This film marked the beginning of a new career working with many great directors from Giuseppe Bertolucci to Marco Risi, from Luchetti to Cristina Comencini, from Ettore Scola to Gabriele Salvatores (the actor delivered an unforgettable performance in "Mediterraneo", a film that won the Oscar for Best Foreign Film in 1992). In addition to co-starring with Michael York, Ben Kingsley, Andie McDowell, and others, in the telefilm directed by Alberto Negrin "Il segreto del Sahara", Abatantuono was also Inspector Corso in "Eurocops". This was a European co-produced television series. In 1997 Abatantuono also began writing. He is in fact author of his autobiography "Eccezzziunale veramente", to be released by Zelig/Baldini & Castoldi. Diego Abantuono's passion for cabaret, however, has never left him to this day. And thus in 2002 he became art director and presenter of Colorado Café.
